**NATIONAL SHERIFFS' ASSOCIATION SUPPORTS GOALS AND IDEALS  
OF THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE  
ADMINISTRATORS (AAMVA)**

**WHEREAS**, the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) represents the state and provincial officials in the United States and Canada who administer and enforce motor vehicle laws; and develops model programs in motor vehicle administration, law enforcement and highway safety;

**WHEREAS**, AAMVA also serves as an information clearinghouse in the areas of motor vehicle laws; and law enforcement and highway safety, as well as acting as the international spokesman for these interests;

**WHEREAS**, AAMVA has developed a program known as the Fraudulent Document Recognition Training to train law enforcement on the techniques of fraudulent document recognition without the need for expensive forensic tools, as well as explain to law enforcement the covert security features found in a variety of documents;

**WHEREAS**, AAMVA has had several requests from law enforcement agencies throughout the country to make their Fraudulent Document Recognition Training more readily available and affordable;

**WHEREAS**, as an over-arching concept, stopping identity theft and protecting the integrity of the driver license to help prevent fraud and terrorism is consistent with the mission of both the AAMVA and the National Sheriffs' Association;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the National Sheriffs' Association supports the goals and ideals of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA);

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the National Sheriffs' Association supports AAMVA's Fraudulent Document Recognition Training program as a tool to help law enforcement identify fraudulent documents.
