Dear Congresswoman Clark and Congresswoman Ros-Lehtinen:

On behalf of the National Sheriffs' Association (NSA) and the more than 3,000 elected sheriffs nationwide, I write to you today in support of legislation you intend to introduce, the *Pet and Women Safety (PAWS) Act*. This bill addresses an often forgotten piece of the discussion surrounding domestic violence issues.

As you know, many domestic violence victims delay leaving a dangerous environment for fear of what may happen to their pets. As many as one-quarter of those who do leave a dangerous environment report returning out of concern for their pets. Your bill would address these concerns by expanding federal domestic violence protections to include pets and establish a federal grant program specifically designed to assist domestic violence victims to shelter their pets. Furthermore, your bill takes the important step of encouraging states to expand their own protections for the pets of domestic violence victims. By establishing these protections and programs, you are acknowledging the important place that pets hold in the lives of domestic violence victims.
