## RE: Counter-UAS authorities for state and local law enforcement and corrections

Dear Speaker Johnson, Leader Thune, Leader Jeffries, Leader Schumer, and Leader Scalise:

On behalf of the undersigned national public safety associations - representing thousands of state and local law enforcement and corrections agencies nationwide - we urge Congress to include comprehensive counter-UAS authority for state and local agencies in the final FY 2026 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). State and local public safety personnel need clear authority to detect, track, identify, and, when necessary, mitigate drones that threaten public safety. The threat is growing far faster than current law allows agencies to respond, and we appreciate the

work underway to close this gap by ensuring state and local agencies have meaningful, operationally useful authorities in the conference agreement.

We appreciate the ongoing efforts in Congress and the Administration to advance updated counter-UAS language that would authorize trained state and local public safety personnel to conduct counter-UAS operations at large public events, critical infrastructure sites, and correctional facilities. The latest draft proposal reflects a meaningful step forward: it replaces the pilot program model with a comprehensive framework for state and local agencies, supported by federal training requirements, approved-technology lists, and strong oversight. This approach aligns with the scale of the threat and the operational readiness of public safety agencies, and incorporates protections to ensure public safety including airspace safety.

State and local public safety agencies across the country face a widening capability gap. Drones are increasingly used for criminal purposes - from smuggling contraband into correctional facilities to interfering with emergency response aircraft - yet agencies lack the legal tools to act. Limited pilot programs cannot meet this operational reality; they authorize only a handful of agencies and leave the vast majority of communities without any response capability. We respectfully urge Congress to establish a comprehensive counter-UAS framework that empowers trained state and local personnel to safely detect, track, and mitigate unlawful drone activity.

Timely action is essential. The United States is preparing for the 2026 FIFA World Cup, America 250 celebrations, and the 2028 Olympic Games - events that will bring millions of attendees to venues across multiple jurisdictions. Federal agencies alone cannot meet operational demand, and a pilot-based framework would leave most without the ability to respond to drone threats. State and local agencies need clear authority well before these events begin.

State and local public safety agencies are on the front lines of this threat and are prepared to implement these authorities responsibly and with full accountability. We urge Congress to act by providing clear, counter-UAS authority for trained state and local agencies in the final FY 2026 NDAA. Doing so will give public safety professionals the tools they need to protect the public, safeguard major events, and meet the growing operational demands posed by unlawful drone activity.
